#### Luke 13:10 -17

Imagine being so crippled and bent that you only see the footprints of others but never experience the joy of looking upward to a mountain or a changing sky of sweeping clouds and birds dancing in the thermals. Imagine your vision being downward day after day for eighteen years! The woman in this week's gospel faced this reality. Physically, socially and emotionally she was tied to the earth, not by gravity, but by illness; forever forced to see the very thing to which she would return, dust. But Jesus saw her, called her, healed her and then made it clear to onlookers that whilst they'd not caused her infirmity, they had nonetheless failed to offer even the most basic decencies, choosing rules and tradition over heart-felt compassion. Truly their eyes were blurred - by the accumulated dust of self-concern. This week let us challenge ourselves to see the world through God's clear vision. When called by Jesus, let us courageously interrupt tragedies ignored by institutions or rules and instead offer bold grace to those denied healing, care and dignity. Blessings – Susan Blackburn
