

Sunday's Gospel reading - Luke 12: 13-21 Wealth can be a burden as well as a blessing. Luke is particularly concerned with the right relationship to money and so urges his readers to be "rich towards God" as a first priority. The parable is of the rich fool who was blessed with good returns for his labour - nothing wrong with that - but who sought his personal security and ease through abundance of his possessions, is held up as an example. At his demise these possessions counted for nothing. We commonly regard Jesus' hearers as poor and landless labourers and such may well have been true. But to them, as much as to the wealthy among us, the word of Jesus points to a perennial wisdom. As one of the wealthy nations amidst a great sea of global poverty, how might we take to heart Jesus' words. "So it is those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich towards God"?

Uniting WA Breakfast Blitz


