A reflection on Luke 16:1–13 for zoom service at KUC on Sunday.

This Sunday's gospel throws up big questions that a small newsletter cannot fully address. In this parable where a manager misuses his authority and his master's resources it seems Jesus shockingly approves of his shrewdness and conniving. What!!! It might help to know that when Jesus refers to "dishonest wealth", it is translated from Greek and can mean "worldly" or unrighteous" wealth, i.e. riches often gained through unjust systems. Here, Jesus possibly recognizes money is seldom accrued by perfect means, rather, it is often tainted by imperfect people with very imperfect, questionable practices. Perhaps then, in this much probed passage, Jesus is calling us all to see that worldly people can be very driven in handling riches, maybe more so than those entrusted with God's kingdom riches. Jesus may be challenging us all to be less complacent and just as driven as we steward God's wealth and resources: of course, with a shrewdness drawn from a foundation of Christ-like integrity. There is so much more to be said, but I hope this gives us a kickstart. Blessings to you in your theological exploring! Susan Blackburn
