Reflection on 2nd Timothy: Ever since time began, older experienced people have been passing their knowledge to younger people. One has got to listen carefully but never be discouraged when mistakes have been made, but learn from mistakes. When reading the letters of 1st and 2nd Timothy in the New Testament, we hear how Paul, the veteran Apostle, teaches young Timothy, who is at the beginning of his Christian ministry. Someone has likened the friendship of Paul and Timothy to that of David and Jonathan in the Old Testament (2 Samuel, chapter 1). Realising that the times are tough, Paul says, never be afraid of public opinion and fight the good fight. In the first century there were many false teachings being proclaimed. However it is the Gospel of Jesus Christ which is the centre of the Church's proclamation. Here is a strong appeal for loyalty to Jesus Christ and His Gospel and also for good order in the Church. Paul is sharing his experience. This is a message for all generations and especially ours.
