Reflection: Luke 18:1–8

Jesus tells the parable of a widow who will not give up. She pleads for justice from a heartless judge, and her persistence wears him down. Jesus teaches, if even an unjust judge responds to relentless petitioning, how much more will God—who is just and compassionate—hear the cries of his people? The widow embodies the kind of faith that keeps praying when answers seem delayed, injustices continue, and people still get hurt. She refuses to let go of hope amidst these woundings. Here, Jesus shows how God is not distant nor indifferent. He is near to those who cry out day and night. Faith, therefore, is not a chore or a religious rule to be obeyed, it is the connective tissue to the One who holds us in the darkness. Neither is it the absence of fear - faith is the courage to persist in prayer, even when trembling. May the Son of Man find such faith in all of us when he comes again.
