

A Refection on Luke 21:19 Jesus calmed the storm of fear faced by his disciples, saying: "By your endurance you will gain your souls." Here, he did not pretend difficulties would not arise, or that God would miraculously erase them. Indeed, he had just confirmed a disturbing truth: they would hear of many horrors, even the holiest place, the temple, would fall. But Jesus made two promises to quell uncertainty. First, he would provide them with words and wisdom to withstand and contradict the enemy, and second, they would gain their souls through endurance. Oh, friends, how often we would prefer an angel with a flaming sword to dispense with all this world's sufferings — and our own! But instead, Christ calls us to an active endurance by steadfast faith. It is not that suffering saves us — for only Christ saves — but in clinging to Jesus and being anchored to God, we live out our faith testifying to God's power and control over everything. This is not steadfast grit, rather, humble acknowledgement that we are prepared to place our lives in God's hands. Should this even result in death, he remains the God of the living for we gain our souls - we gain eternal life.
