

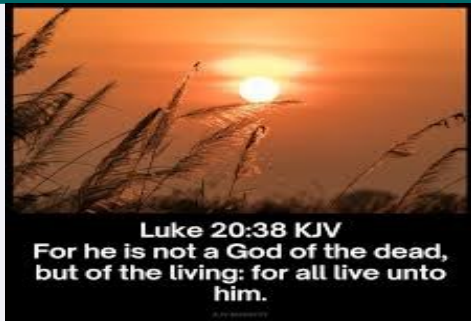

**WE REMEMBER.** This coming week millions of people will pause to remember the day when World War One stopped. That is now beyond the lifetime of most people still alive. The 11th November is used as a date to also remember the end of World War 2. However it still took a number of years after that before things returned to normal. For some who were wounded during the wars, they carried the scars and wounds, both physical and mental, for the rest of their lives. Christians regularly remember the sacrifice of Jesus on the Cross when he died. This was to demonstrate God's Love. This is what we know as the Sacrament of Holy Communion; some call it the Eucharist or the Lord's Supper. Jesus instituted this Liturgy when he said "Remember me as you eat the bread and drink the cup". It is a Thanksgiving for the fact that we can be forgiven for our sins and find peace with God through Jesus Christ. In other words, a sign of God's Grace.
