Reflection on Mat 3: 1-12 It's said that "the truth will set you free". In the gospel reading, it's important to remember that the truth will set us free - but it might also make us weird! John the Baptist cut a strange figure; odd clothes, a bizarre diet, and intense preaching about axes and fire. In the tradition of the Hebrew prophets, John again calls Israel to get its house in order, repent, and prepare for the new thing God is doing.

The new and liberating reality that broke into our world in the incarnation of Jesus was outlandish and unorthodox when John announced it, and we should continue to be baffled and perplexed by it today. God's kingdom doesn't confirm our worldviews; nor does it fit neatly into our political boxes. It contradicts what might be touted as "just common sense" and rarely makes for a good cost benefit analysis. But as strange as this new God-reality is, it is the only one that can set us free.
