Reflection: Matt 4: 12-23 Congregations of the Uniting Church are invited to mark the Day of Mourning this Sunday. The observance of a Day of Mourning was endorsed by the 15th Assembly arising from a request from the UAICC - Uniting Aboriginal and Islander Christian Congress (UAICC) and has been marked on the Sunday before 26 January since 2019. This day provides an opportunity to reflect on the dispossession and continuing injustices experienced by Australia's First Peoples, to acknowledge our shared history, and to renew our commitment to justice and healing.

The scripture passage is interpreted as a call to repentance, a move from darkness into light, and an invitation to participate in a new just, and reconciling future.

Genocide in the Wildflower State

is a 2024 documentary that investigates the systematic, state-run policies of forced child removal, eugenics, and assimilation against Aboriginal people in Western Australia during the 20th century. The film highlights how, for over sixty years (roughly 1905–1972), the Western Australian government aimed to dismantle Aboriginal families and culture to ensure white settler dominance, a process identified as genocide by the 1997 *Bringing Them Home* report.
